- A new AR website is under development, we are migrating from Colivre to Wordpress.
 Archives will be backed up on the cloud and Clusters will have editing access to control what is internal and what is public.
 Clusters will also have creative control over how information is organised and represented on the site.
- The content will need to be revised and corrected in some parts therefore the £2000 from Mercator will be used to pay honoraria to volunteers (for content and translations) instead of paying for the development of an independent ARAC site.
 (Praise has already come forward and offered a hand regarding the new website).
- Website scheduled to be completed by June/July.
- A proposal was made to revise our organisational structure from WGs by city to organisation by persons and clusters given changes that have taken place over time..
- Rethinking learning units; both pre-existing and creation of new ones
